# ABOUT BWG'S **Drinking Water System**

Bradford West Gwillimbury's drinking water supply is provided by two municipal wells (Church Well No.1 and Church Well No.2), as well as treated surface water supplied by InnServices from the Innisfil Lake Simcoe Water Filtration Plant (ILS WFP).

There are two Standpipes positioned within the footprint of the Town - each including a booster pumping station and re-chlorination system. In addition to the standpipes, there is one monitoring station located in Bond Head, one Water Tower equipped with a re-chlorination system and one grade level reservoir that receives treated surface water from the ILS WFP.



## SYSTEM PROCESS



Ground water is pumped directly from an aquifer to Church Well No. 1 and 2. Raw and treatedwater is tested for the presence of microbiological contaminants and 65+ organic/ inorganic compounds.





Church Well water is treated with liquid Chlorine before distributing to users.

Although the water from the ILS WTP is already treated, we re-chlorinate as necessary before distributing to users. The treated water is once again tested.
The DWS is equipped with a Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA) system which allows operations staff the ability to monitor and control the drinking water system remotely and continuously.





Residents receive drinking water that is compliant with provincial standards. We are held to strict legislation and guidelines to ensure optimum water quality.

BWG's Drinking Water is regularly monitored for the presence of microbiological contaminants at both Church Well sites and throughout the entire distribution system. In addition to microbiological sampling, BWG's water is routinely tested for over 65 other organic and inorganic compounds.
